What are the strengths of the provision

- The Educator provides a well organised learning and play environment, that is fully resourced to support each child's development needs, both indoors and in the garden.
- The children clearly feel safe and happy, playing together and being attentively supported by the Educator while making good developmental progress through play.
- Parents are exceptionally happy with the care that their children receive. For example, one parent comments that their child "absolutely loves spending their week with the Educator and is very happy when dropped off for the day." While another parent comments that their child "has made a huge leap in their development."
- The Educator focuses on understanding the childrens' needs and plans well to support each child, through their individual development journey and in partnership with parents.
- The Educator plans activities to support identified development needs and building upon the children's interests, resulting in highly engaged children who are flourishing.
- Children's communication skills are nurtured extremely well, with the Educator providing on-going communication support through discussions, singing rhymes and providing access to story books throughout the day.
- Children enjoy a day of fun and learning that supports their emotional well-being through daily routines. For example, children transition from the morning play to lunch time with a little game of popping bubbles, before washing their hands.
- Children's health and well-being is supported through a healthy menu of homemade foods. Along with daily play in the garden and trips to the local parks.

Comments on Safeguarding

- The Educator is fully attentive to her role of keeping the children safe. Using risk assessments to maintain safety of the children while in her home and on outings.
- The Educator is knowledgeable of how to refer causes of concern that she may have about children, families or household members.

What does the childminder need to do to improve?

- Develop the interaction opportunities for children when singing songs and rhymes.
- Provide more opportunities to develop children's independence, particularly with self-care routines.
