#### What are the strengths of the provision

- The Early Educator is a dedicated and committed practitioner who strives to offer thought provoking activities that inspire children to challenge themselves and make rapid progress.
- Deep and meaningful relationships ensure children feel safe and secure in the setting. Self-regulation is well supported, with feelings and emotions regularly discussed and shared in daily routines.
- Interactions are fantastic, there are evidently strong and respectful relationships that ensure children are safe and happy in their learning environment.
- The Early Educator is unwavering in her approach and dedication in seeking bespoke continued professional development that is highly focussed in improving her support for the children in her care.
- Rigorous self-evaluations ensure the practitioner continually reflects on her practice and meets the needs of her children superbly.
- Children are immersed into a vocabulary rich environment where their communication and language skills are continually developed through activities. For example, through puppet play and expressive story times.
- Parental relationships are a key focus for the Early Educator. Parents appreciate the support offered and state 'She is always available to talk and has made a positive impact on my daughter.'
- Parents are regularly informed of their child's next steps and are included in their education through social media and individual learning journals.
- A dedicated playroom offers children a plethora of high quality resources that are easily accessible to all.
- A highly stimulating and challenging curriculum carefully intertwines children's interests, local festivals, outdoor learning and next steps to ensure children are motivated to learn.
