What are the strengths of the provision

- Loving and supportive relationships offered by the Educator ensure children feel safe and they are supported to thrive. All children are happy and settled.
- The Educator inspires children through expressive reading and singing songs. She encourages them to join in with actions and supports their acquisition of language.
- Children's personal needs are met and opportunities for the spread of infection are minimised. The Educator's Home Nursery is clean, well ventilated and homely.
- The Educator considers children's interests and activities completed at home, in her planning. This ensures children are motivated to learn.
- The Educator is a reflective practitioner who continually evaluates how she can improve her practice and the opportunities she offers children in her care.
- The local environment is well utilised with children receiving many opportunities to enjoy outdoor learning. For example, regular trips to Penge Park and South Norwood Lake.
- Children's behaviour is good and they freely share toys during play. Manners are encouraged and well used by children, especially during meal times.
- The Educator offers support and coaching to her assistant ensuring she settles into her role and understands her responsibilities

Comments on Safeguarding

- Safeguarding is effective. However, the Educator has not filled in her Safeguarding Policy with the details of the Local Safeguarding Partners. Although this is a requirement, there is minimal impact on the children she cares for because her knowledge is robust.
- The Educator has a deep understanding of a wide range of safeguarding concerns, including the Prevent Duty, Female Genital Mutilation and County Lines. This ensures children are safe and their welfare is held in high regard.

What does the childminder need to do to improve?

- Develop strategies to strengthen children's concentration in activities.
- Strengthen the use of assessment of children when planning activities to ensure children make rapid progress.
