What are the strengths of the provision

- The Educator has made a lot of progress since her last inspection and has a good attitude to improving further.
- The Educator considers children's current interests in her planning.
- Communication is well supported as the Educator uses short sentences and repeating phrases with children.
- Children are very happy to play and explore at the home nursery and enjoy a range of activities throughout the day both indoors and in the local area. The local environment is well utilised with children receiving daily opportunities to enjoy outdoor learning including trips to local visitor farms, soft play centres and Epping Forest.
- Children's behaviour is good; they regularly share toys during play and follow clear boundaries. Manners are used by children, especially during meal times.
- The Educator is very enthusiastic and regularly sings with children, asks questions to challenge them in their learning and supports them in their play. For example, supporting them in pouring water with cups in water play.
- Children feel safe in their environment with the Educator offering plenty of cuddles and smiles throughout the day, nurturing younger children.

Comments on Safeguarding

- Safeguarding is effective. The Educator has developed an improved understanding of a range of safeguarding concerns, identifying signs and symptoms for these and the correct local reporting procedures.

What does the childminder need to do to improve?

- The Educator needs to develop a stronger understanding of appropriate levels of challenge due to some expectations being too high for the age of children.
- The Educator must have a firm knowledge of all languages children are immersed in at home and support these in learning and play.
