What are the strengths of the provision

- The Early Educator offers warm and supportive attachments to children. She encourages children to experiment and investigate, whilst allowing them to develop their confidence and independence when completing activities.
- Extremely expressive reading is evidently routine at the setting, with children deeply engaged in the animated story telling. The Early Educator offers questions to children to further challenge them.
- Children's interests and focus topics are carefully considered when planning outings. For example animal topics are supported by visits to Mudchute Farm and bird watching at St John's Park.
- The Early Educator values the importance of ensuring children receive balanced and nutritious meals; she provides fresh snacks and homemade meals each day.
- Children are happy to play and explore in their learning environment. They are encouraged to share and use manners as they play with their peers.
- The Early Educator strives to ensure parents are kept informed of the activities their child enjoys each day and the progress they are making.
- Older children are prepared well for school; the Early Educator offers many activities to support them for their transition to local primary schools.
- Reflections and evaluations are used when planning future activities to ensure children's needs are met.

Comments on Safeguarding

- Safeguarding is ineffective. The Early Educator does not demonstrate a robust understanding of wider safeguarding concerns including witchcraft and toxic trio, possible identifying signs and symptoms to look out for or the correct reporting procedures.
- The Early Educator does not have a clear knowledge and understanding of the government's Prevent Duty guidance, possible signs and symptoms to consider or the professional bodies she would need to contact to raise a concern.

What else does the childminder need to do to improve?

- Ensure assessments are effectively used when designing clear next steps for children.
- Continue to develop a range of strategies to support children's positive behaviour.
