#### What are the strengths of the provision

- The Early Educator offers a warm and welcoming setting that is a true home-from-home environment. A dedicated playroom offers children a plethora of exciting resources including mark-making tools, building blocks and a climbing frame.
- Positive, supportive and nurturing relationships ensure children feel happy, safe and secure as they explore their learning environments, developing an improved sense of confidence and resilience in completing tasks and activities.
- The Early Educator prides herself in strengthening her practice and understanding of child development. She uses focussed continuous professional development to develop a deeper knowledge of this to improve the activities and routines she offers to children.
- A clear and sequenced curriculum, aids children in achieving their next steps. When appropriate the Early Educator designs learning opportunities around cultural festivals and seasonal activities; planting seeds in her garden and celebrating Ramadan, for example.
- Children are offered many opportunities to explore and learn in their local environment. Regular visits to the local library, Morden Park and soft play areas are all intended to strengthen children's communication and social development.
- Children are offered a varied and balanced menu choices including jerk chicken and rice, lamb mince and chickpea patty served with greek yoghurt and cucumber.
- Following daily reflections, activities are carefully evaluated and adapted to consistently meet children's individual needs.

#### Comments on Safeguarding

- Safeguarding is effective. The Early Educator has a strong understanding of a range of safeguarding concerns. She can confidently explain identifying signs of abuse and her local reporting procedures.
- The Early Educator has carefully risk assessed her Home Nursery, demonstrating how she values the safety of children in her care.

#### What does the childminder need to do to improve?

- Ensure children are challenged further in play to make rapid progress towards their next steps.
